Dear Residents,

I am pleased to report the current information regarding today's COVID-19 testing. We have completed testing of all Assisted Living and Memory Care residents and residents of Skilled Nursing that have not previously tested positive. All resident results were negative. We have tested approximately half of our staff members at the time of this report, and those results have all been negative. There has been no change in the status of our residents in Skilled Nursing who are recovering from COVID-19.

Our current numbers as of today are:

total: 13 (no change) | with symptoms: 13 | without symptoms at this time: 0

 - Residents originally residing in Independent Living admitted to Skilled Nursing: 1 (no change)
- **COVID-19-positive residents who have passed away: 2 (no change)**
